As a graduate of Niagara College Social Service Worker Program, Kim has 25+ years of professional experience within and along side the child welfare system. Kim continues her educational journey working towards a BA in Psychology through Athabasca University. Kim's professional career began at the Canadian Mental Health Association following a placement, she worked full-time running the agency's Drop-In Program for youth, as well as their Safe Bed Program.

In 2001 Kim accepted a position with a local child welfare agency as an Intake and Family Resource Worker, where she worked with families in crisis and then in a supportive role connecting them with community resources. In 2005, Kim accepted a role as a Parent Support Worker, still within the child welfare system. This role honed Kim's advocacy skills while she worked with families within the community, using a child-focused, strength-based approach in keeping families intact.

The knowledge Kim gained working with children and families within the child welfare system, she took to her next role as a Case Manager for 8+ years, at an OPR licensed with the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services. She took her strength-based approach to supporting foster parents and advocating for children in-care using, her trauma informed parenting lens.
